

## Fruit Blossom

12 1/2" x 12 1/2" unfinished  
(12" x 12" finished)

Background - white

C - 2" square  
cut 8

cut later

A - 1 1/2" x 10 1/2" rectangle  
cut 2

B - 1 1/2" x 12 1/2" rectangle  
cut 2

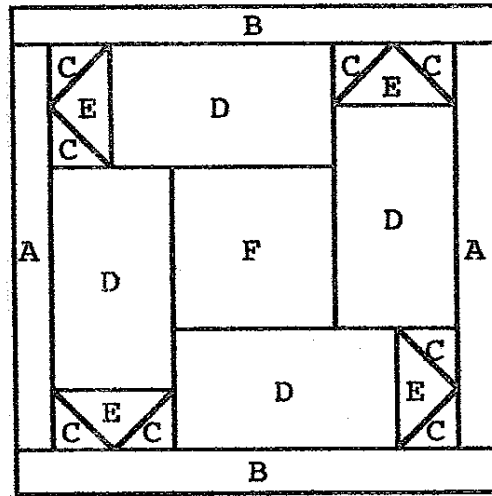
Petals - your choice of fruit

D - 3 1/2" x 6" rectangle  
cut 4

E - 2" x 3 1/2" rectangle  
cut 4

Center of flower - your choice

F - 4 1/2" square



We're going to make 4 flying geese blocks. Using petals **E**, place a background **C** at one corner. Draw a diagonal line one background **C** to keep you on track if desired. Sew from corner to corner, or on drawn line, on background **C**. Before trimming, make sure your background **C** covers corner.

Place another background **C** on the other corner; sew corner to corner ( drawing diagonal line if desired). Trim.

Sew flying geese to the end of each petals **D**.

Lay out flower. The first seam you sew is going to be a partial seam. Here we go. Take one petal **D-E** and the center of flower **F**, line up bottom (non flying geese end) of petal **D-E** with an edge of center of flower **F**. Sew the two together starting at the bottom of petal unit and stopping about halfway up center of flower **F**. Work clockwise, adding petal units. Once you've attached the fourth petal unit complete the partial seam starting where you ended.

At this point your flower should measure 10 1/2" square. Cut background **A** and background **B**, adjusting measurement if necessary. Sew on background **A** then background **B**.

Now all we have to do is enjoy the fruit of your sewing.
