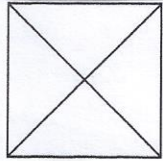


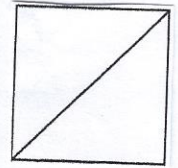
November Birds in Flight

Fall Colors of your choice should be used for piecing this block. Look over the block pattern and determine how many different colors you wish to use. In an effort to keep it simple I used four fabrics but you could use up to 7 or 8 fabric scraps to build the block. You may wish to add a bit or spray starch to the blocks to help with the bias edges and there are a number of bias edges.

Two $7 \frac{1}{8}$ inch squares, cut each on the diagonal making 4 triangles. These triangles are G, H, I, and note not all triangles will be used.



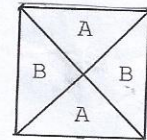
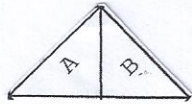
Two $4 \frac{7}{8}$ inch squares, cut on the diagonal making 2 triangles. These triangles are C and F



Three $5 \frac{1}{4}$ inch squares, cut on the diagonal into 4 triangles. These triangles are A, B, D and E. Note that all of these triangles are not required for the block.

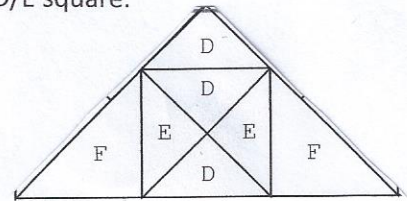


1. Begin with the square in the center of the block. Sew RST two sets of A and B triangles at the right angle corners creating a larger half triangle. Next sew RST the two large A/B triangles together to make a square. Repeat this process with the D and E quarter triangles. Press them and trim dog ears. Some quilters prefer to wait to trim the dog ears because they help align the pieces so if you find this helpful, don't trim them yet.

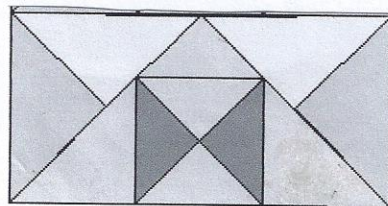


2. Add a C triangle to each side of A/B square and an F to each side of the D/E square.

3. Add A to the top of the A/B square and D to the top of the D/E square.



4. Sew G and I, G and H sets together creating 4 large triangles- sew right angle corners together. Add these triangles to the units made in steps 1 thru 3, see whole block diagram for placement guidance. Press. These two units should be $6 \frac{1}{2}$ inch by $12 \frac{1}{2}$ inch rectangles.



5. Final step is to sew the two units together to complete your birds in flight.
